DEVELOPMENT OF THE ISIPINGO ESTUARY MANAGEMENT PLAN

The Isipingo Estuary Management Plan will be developed in consultation with all relevant stakeholders. It is vital that all stakeholders contribute to developing a Vision for the Isipingo Estuary as well as a set of realistic actions that will assist in achieving the Vision set for the estuary. The degradation of estuaries is often a result of increasing coastal development and human activities. In order to preserve the remaining ecological functioning, biodiversity, and sustainable use of the Isipingo Estuary, effective co-operative management is essential. The Integrated Coastal Management Act (Act No. 24 of 2008) stipulates that estuaries within South Africa must be managed in a co-ordi-

nated and efficient manner.
